"Worried About Cybersecurity? A Little Planning Goes a Long Way"

Presenter: Jim Davis is an Associate Professor in Information Systems in the Ivy College of Business at Iowa State University. He has a long history of working in cybersecurity beginning as an educator and researcher in the 1990s while he was a faculty member in Computer Engineering at ISU, then with more of a management focus while he served as the university's first CIO until 2015. Jim's current research interests are in cybersecurity management and analytics.

Learning Objectives & Program Content:

Few events can be as instantly disruptive to a business as a cybersecurity breach. Recovery from damage to reputation, operations, intellectual property, customer and employee information are often slow and costly. Developing and executing a plan to prevent or mitigate a breach can be a daunting task. Jim will lead a discussion of crucial considerations that can help lead to a robust cybersecurity plan for any size company.

MINUTES – July 2018

Approval of Minutes:

On motion made by Libby, seconded by Ann, motion carried that the minutes of the June meeting be approved as presented in the July bulletin. Treasurer's Report:

Lisa presented the May and June Treasurer's reports prepared by past Treasurer Kate Mulder. (See attached.) As of June 30, 2018, the checking account had \$7,012.52 and the scholarship savings account had \$6,117.39 (with restricted funds of \$1,500 for the current scholarship payable and \$3,100 for the Kathy Strum Memorial Scholarship).
